Occlusal surface - flat

- Place the wand tip FLAT on the occlusal surface of the distal molar
- Activate the wand
- · Cable end pointed at the patient's toes



- Scan in a continue motion pulling the wand toward the bicuspids
- Tilt the wand slightly to the lingual and sweep across the anterior, canine to canine



Lingual surface - vertical orientation



- Leave the wand activated and roll the wand to the lingual surface
- Rotate the wand so that the lens is VERTICAL on the tooth surface



Scan around the lingual surface of the arch in a continuous motion



* Wand will be perpendicular to the teeth and should appear vertical in the viewfinder

Buccal quadrant horizontal orientation



- Roll the wand over the occlusal surface to the buccal surface
- Orient the wand HORIZONTIALLY on the buccal cusps
- Scan around the arch to the midline, dropping the cable end of the wand toward the opposite side of the face



Remove the wand from the mouth but do not turn it off

- Place the wand flat on opposite terminal molar, roll to the buccal and pull the wand forward to scan to the midline
- Roll up to capture the anterior incisal edges



* Wand will be horizontal to the teeth and should appear as they do in the above image in the viewfinder





- Sit the patient up to a 45° angle
- Have the patient open, using the wand to retract the cheek as the patient bites in centric occlusion



Activate the wand

• Bring the wand gently against the tooth anatomy



- Move forward in a wave-like motion capturing 3-4 teeth
- Repeat on the other side using the same technique

*All examples are using the upper arch. Please follow the same technique for the lower arch.

If scanning for Invisalign[®] clear aligners:

Did you capture:

- 2 mm of gingiva
- · Distal wall of terminal molar
- · The complete incisal/occlusal surface
- Mesial & Distal interproximal anatomy (no red or purple
- Accurate bite with patient in centric occlusion

Tips and tricks

- Overhead light and loops should be turned off
- Dry occlusal surface before scanning
- Complete a segment before turning wand off
- While scanning, look at monitor to ensure teeth are in center of the view finder window
- Sit behind the patient at 12 o'clock with the scanner in front of you
- · Patient should be in supine position
- · Scan the bite starting at 1st molar
- Scan yourself and colleagues for practice
- Hold wand under handed, avoiding the vents

Additional scanning tips

Think of a toothbrush when scanning occlusal and anterior surfaces

- Picture the tip of the wand as the bristles of a toothbrush.
- While scanning you should keep the entire wand tip flat on the teeth that you are scanning.
- Just like when you brush your teeth, you keep the bristles flat and in contact with the teeth.

Capturing lingual crowding

- Place wand perpendicular to the arch and use a twisting motion.
 - To capture the distal contact twist your wrist back towards you.
 - To capture the mesial contact twist your wrist the opposite way.



- Place the wand horizontal to the arch and use a rocking motion.
 - To capture the distal anatomy rock the cable end away from the tooth.
 - To capture the mesial anatomy rock the cable end towards the tooth.
